French Dual Language Immersion

In 2013, three DeKalb County schools were awarded a grant from the Georgia Department of Education to initiate dual language immersion programs. To date, that number has increased to 8 DLI school programs in the district.

Rockbridge Elementary School is one that implements a 50/50 dual language immersion model. Students study math, science, and literacy in French. The students in the program also study literacy and social studies with English as the language of instruction.

The immersion program provides important benefits to students in the areas of cognition, achievement, and linguistics. Students will possess a skill that creates a professional competitive advantage, making them more attractive to colleges, career and technical programs, and employers.
