Dual Language Immersion








What is DLI?

In dual language immersion (DLI), students in grades K-5 spend half of their school day in the target language and the other half in English. This is called the 50/50 model.



Students study math, science, and literacy in the target language (French, German, or Spanish) and study social studies, literacy, and specials in English.

Goals of DLI

Our programs focus on the three pillars for dual language education:



Bilingualism and Biliteracy:

Students develop literacy (reading/ writing), oracy (speaking/listening), and metalinguistic awareness.

Academic Achievement:


Students have high achievement in reading & language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies.


Sociocultural Competency:

Students navigate cross-cultural situations with respect and advocacy while forming their own identity as a bilingual person.

Articulation

Students continue to middle school DLI, where they continue to study culture, history, and literacy in the target language. In high school, students can take college-level courses such as AP and Dual Enrollment. Course offerings in high school vary from school to school. There is no DLI continuation to the feeder high school.





We ask that DLI parents participate in educational activities that support the DLI program and provide a home environment that reinforces the goals of the program.
